Video Management System / FUSUS Audit 2025

In accordance with General Order 2023-01 Video Management System, the Public Integrity Unit (PIU) conducted an audit for the year 2025. This audit was conducted independently of the Bureau of Investigations Intelligence Unit, which maintains and operates the Video Management System (VMS).

PIU conducted an audit of VMS viewings as outlined in the General Order:

IV. PROCEDURES

F. VMS Audit

2. The Public Integrity Unit will be responsible for conducting an annual audit of VMS usage, to ensure department employees are only accessing and utilizing VMS technology for legitimate law enforcement and public safety purposes.

During the PIU audit, I looked for oddities, such as: multiple viewings of a certain intersection by an individual officer; extended viewing times; officers viewings outside their sector or viewings when a call cannot be associated with the area. I performed 5 inquiries per month. All were justified and within policy. There was one random audit where the officer viewed traffic cameras in June of 2025 but could not remember why. PIU did not receive any complaints from the public reference abuse of the system.

I found during this audit that it was difficult for officers to remember why they watched video on FUSUS several weeks/months prior. Starting with the 2026 yearly audit I will now do monthly audits so the officers have a better ability to recall why they utilized FUSUS. I will then compile those monthly audits into the 2026 yearly audit that will be sent to the Commander in January 2027.
