Also, if there is a chance that they could qualify for the special refund under KRS 139.515, let me know. They seem to be applying for that refund each year via the increment. For withholding, I went with your revised calculation. Did they try to include withholding from pari-mutuel winnings this year? That's what they did for 2015.
